Welcome

- Chief Harteau welcomed everyone, thanked Michael for the snacks.
- Prayer given for Rev. Graham

- Introduction of ZoeAna (Lake Street Council).
- Self-introductions of CCAC members to ZoeAna.

Recent Events

- Chief Harteau talked about interviewing 40+ cadet candidates w/ D.O. over 2½ days and talked about how good the candidates were.

GVI Discussion

- Talked about the upcoming year-end press conference on Monday and gave a brief explanation of GVI.
- What is the carrot for the offenders targeted by GVI?
- Explanation of MPD's role in initiative along with other partners.
- Asked if there was also a focus on older offenders?
- Explanation of focus on small number of violent offenders.
- Question about sentencing mandatory minimums.
- Talked about Hennepin County court's role in the initiative.
- Question about if elected officials are being informed about initiative.
- Question about how many chronic violent offenders are there?
- Explanation of how small a group of chronic violent offenders cause the most violence and how much training is given to officers routinely.
- Question about how most chronic violent offenders have a violent criminal background. Wants to know how people get added to that list.
- Answered question with an example.
- Question about what type of homicides has happened this year (2017).
- Talked about how many incidents have multiple shooters/victims.
- Concerned about if crime on Lake Street in the spring/summer is a priority.
- Explained that 3rd Precinct is a priority, but 4th Precinct is the most pressing need right now but GVI efforts should force-multiply crime reduction efforts and hold down crime and explained the mechanisms around the "Call-Ins".
- Question about narcotics (heroin) and the spread of violence around town.
- Explained that the ease in getting narcotics is the hardest thing to stop.
- Asks what can the public do to help quell the drug epidemic.
- Explains how his organization is working with the United Tribes on getting help for drug abuse/domestic crime issues.
- Feels there is a lack of coordination between service agencies to deal with issues.
- Asks about if CCAC can help GVI process along?

- Explains how MPD will document the process and recognize successes and also use social media to keep pressure on offenders.
- Asks if the courts/judges would add geo-restrictions to offenders?
- Explains how downtown crime is actually down but attitudes and disrespect fuels a lot of perception of violent crime downtown.

Ongoing and Escalating Violence Downtown

- Expressed frustration about the perception of nightlife downtown.
- Stated that she's open to suggestions on how to make downtown safer.
- Asks if there are more tools available to police to move people along that are loitering and/or contributing to crime.

Community Engagement/ Advisory community can promote better community relationships

- MPD participation in the Annual 100 Black Men Project and the Procedural Justice project.
- Questions about safety structures on new no-vehicle promenade on Nicollet Mall.
- Question about Sanctuary City status and if there are going to be any changes in Minneapolis?
- Updated group on new ISS outreach dispatch CAD system in use downtown. First time used for community outreach; normally used for stadiums and college campuses.
- Update of new initiative with North Point on Domestic Violence and men. His group is also applying for a federal grant with Little Earth about de-escalation techniques (community-based participatory research).

- Update on Sgt. Joey Sandberg, who was inducted into the Roosevelt High School Hall of Fame. He has worked his entire career in the 3rd Precinct. She is very proud of his career, service and treatment of citizens in the precinct.
