STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

Complainant has investigated the facts and circumstances of this offense and believes the following establishes probable cause:

That on September 8, 2018, at approximately 6:47 p.m., officers were dispatched to the 2600 block of 3rd Street North in Minneapolis, Hennepin County, Minnesota, to investigate a robbery. Upon arrival, officers located victim, an identified adult male, lying in the street. Victim was crying out in pain, reported he had been run-over, and sustained injury to his legs.

Victim reported he arrived in the area by vehicle to pickup a woman he identified as Pamela Huffman. Victim reported he arrived and Ms. Huffman was in the company of a male, subsequently identified as JONELL BUTLER, hereafter defendant. Victim agreed to give Ms. Huffman and defendant a ride. Victim reported that once he started driving, defendant punched him several times in the head, pulled out a knife, held it to his throat, and forced him to stop driving. Defendant then shoved victim out of the vehicle and drove away. The vehicle drove over victim's legs. Victim was transported to the hospital where it was determined he sustained a leg fracture and crushing injuries to his leg tissues.

Victim reported several of bank cards in his vehicle were subsequently used in unauthorized transactions. Officers contacted the involved stores, obtained video surveillance of the transactions, and identified the person using the cards was Ms. Huffman. Officers also discovered victim's stolen vehicle was subsequently located in the Minneapolis impound lot.

Officers located, arrested, and spoke with Ms. Huffman. Ms. Huffman acknowledged she entered victim's vehicle with defendant and that defendant pulled a knife on victim and forced him from the vehicle. Ms. Huffman reported she and defendant then fled in the victim's vehicle and that she eventually used bank cards found within the victim's vehicle at several stores without permission. Ms. Huffman agreed to contact defendant and set up a meeting so he could be arrested by law enforcement.

The above-referenced meeting was arranged and on October 9, 2018, officers arrested defendant. Defendant was transported to Room 108 and provided a statement after waiving his Miranda rights. Defendant admitted he entered victim's vehicle with Ms. Huffman and then forced victim out of the vehicle before driving away with Ms. Huffman. Defendant is also a suspect in several other on-going robbery investigations.

At present, defendant is in custody.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

Complainant has investigated the facts and circumstances of this offense and believes the following establishes probable cause:

That on October 5, 2018, at approximately 10:37 p.m., officers were dispatched to 13th Avenue NE and 4th Street NE in Minneapolis, Hennepin County, Minnesota, to investigate a shooting. Upon arrival, officers observed an identified male, hereafter Victim #1, had sustained a gunshot wound to his abdomen. An identified female, hereafter Victim #2, was also on scene. Victim #2 identified herself as Victim #1's girlfriend. Victim #2 reported she and Victim #1 were walking in the area when a white SUV pulled up, stopped, and a black male exited the passenger side. The black male approached, pointed a handgun at them, and demanded money, wallets and phones. Victim #1 handed over his wallet and phone and Victim #2 handed over her wallet. The suspect collected these items and then walked back towards the passenger side door of the white SUV. Victim #1 protested being robbed and suspect responded by shooting Victim #1 in the abdomen from only a few feet away. Suspect then entered the passenger side door of the SUV and it fled from the scene.

Victim #1 was transported to the hospital for his gunshot wound. Victim #1 required surgery and is currently in stable condition.

Officers would later learn two other robberies occurred close in time that overnight in northeast Minneapolis involving the same suspect description, same vehicle description, and the same general behavior. In all cases, the victims were robbed of either money and/or cell phones. (These other cases are being charged out separately).

Officers pinged a victim cell phone to 44th and Nicollet Avenue South. Once there, officers located an abandoned white SUV that matched the suspect vehicle description. Officers looked inside the vehicle and, in plain view, observed a number of cell phones, purses, and cash. The vehicle was secured, towed, and later searched pursuant to search warrant. Inside this vehicle, officers located personal property belonging to Victim #1 and Victim #2 in the present case.

The recovered white SUV was registered to an adult female who, in turn, was identified as the mother of NATALIE BOX. NATALIE BOX was known to be defendant's girlfriend. Defendant was arrested on October 9, 2016 on a separate, fourth aggravated robbery committed in northeast Minneapolis on September 8, 2018 (see MNCIS File No.: 27-CR-18-25320, filed October 11, 2018, charging Aggravated Robbery in the First Degree) NATALIE BOX was with defendant when he was arrested. NATALIE BOX was found to have an outstanding warrant and was arrested. NATALIE BOX was in possession of a cell phone and a warrant was obtained to search the phone. Cell tower location data placed NATALIE BOX'S cell phone at all three above-described robberies that occurred in sequence in northeast Minneapolis on October 5-6, 2018, and showed movement from one robbery to the next and to the next. In addition, officers discovered an "open line" recording on NATALIE BOX'S cell phone where one of the robberies is audio recorded. Officers formed the belief that NATALIE BOX was defendant's driver during the three sequential robberies on October 5, 2018. Officers attempted to speak with NATALIE BOX but she refused to provide a statement.

Officers spoke with defendant about the four robberies. Defendant admitted to committing the robbery on September 8, 2018 (again, reference MNCIS File No.: 27-CR-18-25320). When asked about his involvement in the other three robberies from October 5-6, 2018, defendant stated "No, I don't even have a gun." Officers noted they had not even mentioned the other robberies were committed with a gun.

Thereafter, defendant provided several explanations about the robberies:

In his first version, defendant claimed he was with NATALIE BOX when they were held at gunpoint and kidnapped by two males. Defendant insisted these two males committed the robberies and then made him touch the proceeds, thus explaining why his fingerprints and/or DNA would be present on recovered victim property.

In his second version, defendant now claimed he had no recollection of the kidnapping but was informed of this by NATALIE BOX after the fact. Defendant acknowledged he "could have" committed the robberies but was unsure due to narcotics use.

In his third version, defendant admitted that on October 5, 2018, he was a passenger in the white SUV, that NATALIE BOX was driving and that they drove around Northeast Minneapolis, made many stops, but did not commit any robberies. In this version, he did not claim that he and NATALIE BOX were kidnapped at gunpoint by two males or that he was forced to touch robbery proceeds.

Officers obtained a search warrant for a buccal swab from defendant. DNA testing is pending on several items, including swabs taken from the recovered white SUV and from the recovered robbery proceeds located inside the vehicle.

At present, defendant is in custody on the other above-referenced charged robbery case. Accordingly, your complainant hereby requests this complaint issue by warrant rather than by summons.

Complainant has investigated the facts and circumstances of this offense and believes the following establishes probable cause:

That on October 6, 2018, at approximately 1:02 a.m., officers were dispatched to the area of 12th Avenue SE and University Avenue SE in Minneapolis, Hennepin County, Minnesota, to investigate an armed robbery. Upon arrival, officers spoke with the victims, two identified adult females (hereafter Victim #1 and Victim #2 respectively) and witnesses, two identified adult females (hereafter Witness #1 and Witness #2 respectively).

Victim #1 and Victim #2 and Witness #1 and Witness #2 reported they were walking in the area when they observed a black male standing on the sidewalk. The four crossed the street and noticed the black male followed them. Once across the street, the black male approached them, pulled out a handgun, pointed it at them, and stated, "Give me everything" and "Don't (F-word) run." Witness #1 and Witness #2 ran but Victim #1 and Victim #2 were too afraid to run and remained. Victim #1 turned over her cell phone and Victim #2 turned over cash. The black male took these items and then fled on foot.

Officers would later learn two other robberies occurred close in time that overnight in northeast Minneapolis involving the same suspect description and the same general behavior. Several of these other robberies involved the suspect getting out of and then back into a white SUV. In one of these other robberies, the victim was shot in the abdomen after being robbed at gunpoint. In all cases, the victims were robbed of either money and/or cell phones. (These other cases are being charged out separately).

Officers pinged a victim cell phone to 44th and Nicollet Avenue South. Once there, officers located an abandoned white SUV that matched the suspect vehicle description. Officers looked inside the vehicle and, in plain view, observed a number of cell phones, purses, and cash. The vehicle was secured, towed, and later searched pursuant to search warrant. Inside this vehicle, officers located personal property belonging to the victims of the above-mentioned three separate robberies, including Victim #1's cell phone.

The recovered white SUV was registered to an adult female who, in turn, was identified as the mother of NATALIE BOX. NATALIE BOX was known to be defendant's girlfriend. Defendant was arrested on October 9, 2016 on a separate, fourth aggravated robbery committed in northeast Minneapolis on September 8, 2018 (see MNCIS File No.: 27-CR-18-25320, filed October 11, 2018, charging Aggravated Robbery in the First Degree) NATALIE BOX was with defendant when he was arrested. NATALIE BOX was found to have an outstanding warrant and was arrested. NATALIE BOX was in possession of a cell phone and a warrant was obtained to search the phone. Cell tower location data placed NATALIE BOX'S cell phone at all three above-described robberies that occurred in sequence in northeast Minneapolis on October 5, 2018, and showed movement from one robbery to the next and to the next. In addition, officers discovered an "open line" recording on NATALIE BOX'S cell phone where one of the robberies is audio recorded. Officers formed the belief that NATALIE BOX was defendant's driver during the three sequential robberies on October 5, 2018. Officers attempted to speak with NATALIE BOX but she refused to provide a statement.

Officers spoke with defendant about the four robberies. Defendant admitted to committing the robbery on September 8, 2018 (again, reference MNCIS File No.: 27-CR-18-25320). When asked about his involvement in the other three robberies from October 5-6, 2018, defendant stated "No, I don't even have a gun." Officers noted they had not even mentioned the other robberies were committed with a gun.

Thereafter, defendant provided several explanations about the robberies:

In his first version, defendant claimed he was with NATALIE BOX when they were held at gunpoint and

kidnapped by two males. Defendant insisted these two males committed the robberies and then made him touch the proceeds, thus explaining why his fingerprints and/or DNA would be present on recovered victim property.

In his second version, defendant now claimed he had no recollection of the kidnapping but was informed of this by NATALIE BOX after the fact. Defendant acknowledged he "could have" committed the robberies but was unsure due to narcotics use.

In his third version, JONELL BUTLER admitted that on October 5, 2018, he was a passenger in the white SUV, that defendant was driving and that they drove around Northeast Minneapolis, made many stops, but did not commit any robberies. In this version, he did not claim that he and defendant were kidnapped at gunpoint by two males or that he was forced to touch robbery proceeds.

At present, defendant is in custody.
